Together they own Vintage Tavern in Suffolk's Governor's Pointe, and now their latest Suffolk gem, River Stone Chophouse, complete with a piano lounge. McGann still is an owner of Blue Point Bar & Grill, the habit-forming eatery in Duck, N.C. River Stone serves California-raised, all-natural Harris Ranch beef with chops and steaks aged from 21-28 days. Chef Michael Stevenson from The Capital Grille in Washington, D.C., and general manager Sasha Ebady, previously with Morton's Steakhouse, appear well-suited for what McGann describes as "a high-end chophouse on par with anything offered in New York or California."
